## **Background**

The Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP) is a comprehensive planning document outlining the strategic review of the Upper Grand District School Board's facilities, population projections, and enrolment forecasts. The LTAP is an important step in ensuring alignment of school facilities with the needs of the Board and the communities it serves.

On June 26, 2018, Trustees approved several recommendations in memo PLN:18-10 Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP) Final Report including:

6. That an annual review of the LTAP be conducted in accordance with the process outlined in Section 1 of the Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP) Final Report.

The 2018 LTAP Final Report included a schedule of short and long-term priorities. The purpose of the LTAP Annual Review Report is to ensure that the short-term work plan priorities and timing outlined in the LTAP remain appropriate. The LTAP Annual Review Report also includes information related to French Immersion (FI) trends, and facility partnerships and co-build opportunities. The 2022 Annual Review Report is the last annual review of the 2018 LTAP Final Report. During the 2022-2023 school year, Upper Grand District School Board will be conducting a new comprehensive Long Term Accommodation Plan.

## <u>Issue</u>

To present an update to the LTAP in accordance with Section 1 of the June 2018 Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP) Final Report.

## **Recommendations**

- 1. That memo PLN: 22-13 "2022 Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP) Annual Review Report" dated May 10, 2022 be received.
- 2. That the Communication Plan as described in memo PLN: 22-13 "2022 Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP) Annual Review Report" be approved.

## **Rationale**

Section 1 of the Board's Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP) Final Report 2018 outlined that the LTAP would be reviewed annually and include: updated data, information on changes to Provincial policy or programs affecting the LTAP, changes to accommodation priorities and any relevant information pertaining to Board-wide priorities and initiatives to ensure that identified capital priorities reflect the Board's accommodation and program needs.

Some of the work plan priorities identified in the 2018 LTAP report had to be shifted due to delays in the release of various Ministry guidelines. The following information provides further explanation of changes to the short-term work plan since the last annual update. Additionally, a comprehensive 5-year LTAP report is scheduled in 2022/23 and the work plan priorities will be reviewed and updated during that process.

## **Updated 5 Year Work Plan Priorities**

The work plan priorities table in Appendix A has been updated to reflect the status of work identified in 2021/22 in last year's Annual LTAP report.

## 2021/22 Priorities

Secondary Program Review

The Board is undergoing a Multi-Year Plan (MYP) process to set the board's priorities for the next four years. The comprehensive 5-year LTAP report will follow the MYP. Outcomes from potential program reviews including impacts of online learning opportunities will be included in the analysis of enrolment and school utilization calculations as the information becomes available.

New Guelph Secondary School Boundary Review

The New Guelph Secondary School Boundary Review process has not proceeded as a result of delays in the planning application process (Official Plan and Zoning Bylaw Amendments and Site Plan approval) required to advance the building project.

Further, an approved motion from last year's LTAP Annual Review Report was that:

4. The Board direct staff to complete the Secondary Program Review prior to the completion of the new Guelph Secondary School Boundary Review.

Therefore the timing of the boundary review process will follow the completion of the comprehensive 5-Year LTAP process and Multi-Year Plan.

West Guelph Consolidated JK-8 FI Boundary Review

In Fall 2021, staff completed the feasibility study for the West Guelph Consolidated JK-8 FI program. On October 26, 2021, Trustees passed the following motion:

2. That the Board does not proceed at this time with a public review process to create a consolidated JK-8 FI program in West Guelph due to a lack of sufficient capacity in existing schools.

A boundary review for a consolidated West Guelph JK-8 FI program was scheduled in 2021/22 but was dependent on the outcome of the West Guelph Consolidated JK-8 FI Feasibility Study. Based on the October 2021 Board Motion, the West Guelph Consolidated JK-FI Boundary Review will be reconsidered as part of the comprehensive 5-year LTAP review in 2022/23.

## Considerations in LTAP 5-Year Review:

There are number of other priorities that had been identified in the workplan and will need further consideration when undertaking the comprehensive LTAP process which is scheduled for 2022/23 school year. The process will align with the Board's Multi Year Plan. These priorities will include:

- 1. Clair-Maltby Elementary School Capital Priorities Request in South Guelph.
- 2. Board Motions
  - a. IB Feasibility Studies for Dufferin County, Erin and Wellington County
  - b. Dufferin Secondary FI Study
- 3. Centre Wellington Elementary Boundary Review

The Capital Priorities Request was approved by the Ministry in Fall 2021.

4. South Guelph Regular Track Boundary Review

A South Guelph Boundary Review was included in the original LTAP 2018 as enrolment projections indicated a need to rebalance enrolments in South Guelph by that time. Enrolment pressure is projected at several South Guelph elementary schools as a result of ongoing residential development including at Jean Little PS, Priory Park PS and Rickson Ridge PS. Updated information in the comprehensive LTAP review will provide staff with a better indication of the timing for conducting a boundary review for the regular track elementary schools in South Guelph.

## **Updated Enrolment Projections**

## Elementary Enrolment Projections

The total elementary enrolment including both in person and remote learners in 2021/22 is 24,172 students which is approximately 550 more students or an enrolment increase of approximately 2% from last year. This is consistent with historical annual increases in elementary enrolment with the exception of 2020/21 when the elementary enrolment had declined as a result of the pandemic.

Appendix B includes enrolment projections by school and review area. Enrolments have been updated to include October 2021 actual enrolments and projected 2022/23 enrolments.

Since the original 2018 LTAP, there have been many changes that had an impact on enrolment projections including changes in the pace, timing and location of new residential developments as well as changes in participation and retention rates across grades. The projections made in the original 2018 LTAP for the 2022 year have been included in Appendix B and compared to the updated 2022 projections.

More extensive residential growth has occurred in certain areas within the Board's jurisdiction including in South and East Guelph as well as in Wellington North, Mapleton, Grand Valley and Mulmur resulting in enrolment pressures in many of our schools. Consideration needs to be given to options for managing the current and projected enrolment pressure at various schools such as through boundary changes or capital improvements to increase school capacity. Further, the need for new elementary school sites is being reviewed in the areas of Hillsburgh, Erin, Orangeville, Grand Valley, Shelburne, Guelph, etc. This information will be reflected in detail in the comprehensive 5-Year LTAP Review.

Updated enrolment projections have highlighted some schools where staff are monitoring more immediate enrolment pressures and increased portable requirements. The following elementary schools will need to be considered in the comprehensive 5 Year LTAP review.

## Primrose ES

Primrose ES has an OTG capacity of 377 pupil places and the 2021-22 enrolment at Primrose is 537 students. The enrolment of the school increased by over 60 students between 2020-21 and 2021-22. It is projected that the school may require a 6<sup>th</sup> portable for the 2022-23 school year and enrolment is projected to increase in the future due to proposed subdivision development within its boundary. The Primrose PS site is constrained making the placement of more than 6 portables difficult due to the site

configuration, grading and limited parking. Consideration needs to be given to options for managing the enrolment pressure at Primrose ES.

## Brant Ave PS

Brant Ave PS has an OTG capacity of 282 pupil places and its enrolment is 270 students in 2021-22. Enrolment at Brant Ave PS is projected to grow as a result of new subdivision development within its boundary. It may be necessary to consider reassigning the Morningcrest Development Area (DA) to another school for the 2023-24 school year.

## Salem PS

Salem PS has an OTG capacity of 213 pupil places and its enrolment in 2021-22 is 274 students. There are 3 portables on site with a need for an additional portable for the 2022-23 school year to accommodate a projected enrolment of over 300 students. Growth that is occurring at Salem PS is a result of the Storybrook subdivision in Northwest Fergus. Changes in DA grade assignments between Salem PS and Elora PS may be necessary for the 2023-24 school year.

## Secondary Enrolment Projections

In 2021/22, the total secondary enrolment is 11,276 students, which is approximately 50 more students (or approximately 0.4% higher) than 2020/21.

Secondary enrolments in Appendix B have been updated to reflect actual October 2021 secondary enrolments and projected 2022/23 enrolments. The secondary enrolments are based on a headcount of students and does not factor in the historical drop in enrolment by Second Semester nor the fact that some students are not full time. The secondary enrolment projections made in the original 2018 LTAP for the 2022 year have been included in Appendix B and compared to the updated 2022 projections.

## School Utilization in 2021/22

Table 1 provides a summary of the number of elementary and secondary schools that are classified as underutilized, well utilized or overcrowded in 2021/22. Since the 2020/21 report, there are 3 more elementary schools that fall in the overcrowded (over 110%) category and 3 fewer elementary schools that are categorized as underutilized (under 80%). The same number of elementary schools are categorized as well utilized (between 80-110%). For secondary schools, one additional school (Orangeville DSS) was added to the underutilized category from last year.

Table 2 shows that there are approximately 1,800 empty elementary spaces out of a total of 26,026 elementary pupil places across the UGDSB in 2021/22. This represents a total elementary utilization of 93%. In 2021/22 the Planning area with the highest utilization rate is South Guelph and the lowest utilization rate is the Town of Erin. By 2027, it is projected that there will be a shortfall of elementary pupil places based on the Board's projected total elementary school capacity which includes a new 308 pupil place school in Centre Wellington.

In the secondary panel, there are approximately 13 empty secondary spaces in 2021/22 which represents a 100% utilization rate. The 2027 utilization assumes that the new high school in Guelph opens with an additional 894 pupil places. In the long term it is projected that the board's total secondary utilization will be remain at approximately 100% occupancy.

## **Potential Facility Partnership Space**

## Elementary Schools

Policy 319 – Community Planning and Facility Partnerships requires that potential facility partnership space be identified according to the following criteria:

- Facilities that have been 60% utilized or less for the past two (2) years and/or facilities that have had two hundred (200) or more unused pupil places for at least the past two (2) years.
- Facilities that are projected to be 60% utilized or less for the next five (5) years.

As outlined in Table 3, there are three (2) elementary schools that meet the criteria for the 2021/22 school year based either on utilization or space parameters.

Alma PS (57%) –Alma PS has been below 60% utilized since 2019/20. Alma PS is currently accommodating an ECPP and while the ECPP students do not count toward the school's enrolment and utilization, the board recognizes the value of the programming and accommodates this use. Due to residential development pressures, it is expected that the school enrolment will increase above 60% occupancy in the next coming years.

Ross R. MacKay PS (50%) – Ross R. Mackay PS has been below 60% utilization for the last 3 years. However, in the next coming years the enrolment at the school is projected to start to increase as a result of the availability of wastewater services in the Town of Erin and planned residential development growth in the community of Hillsburgh.

**Willow Road PS (54%)** – The Willow Road PS utilization was less than 60% in the last 3 years and the school had more than 200 unused pupil places. The school is accommodating an Education and Community Partnership Program (ECPP, formerly known as Section 23 program) in two unused classrooms. Although the students do not get factored into the utilization of the school, the available space allows the Board to assist third party agencies deliver educational services to some of our most vulnerable youth.

The long-term projection for Willow Rd PS includes the accommodation of Grades 4-8 FI feeding from Gateway PS which was the outcome of the West Guelph FI Boundary Review (2017). The utilization of Willow Road PS improves with the gradual growing in of FI grades.

**Orangeville DSS** – Orangeville DSS has been added to the list of secondary schools with more than 200 pupil places of excess capacity for the last 2 years. Enrolment is projected to remain relatively flat through the projection period to 2027. The majority of remaining residential development in Orangeville is planned for north of Hansen Blvd in northwest Orangeville which is assigned to Westside SS.

Prior to staff considering the potential for partnership opportunities at Orangeville DSS it would be beneficial to have completed the comprehensive LTAP 5-Year review and any program reviews as a result of Board's Multi Year Plan.

**Norwell DSS** – Norwell DSS has had more than 200 pupil places of excess capacity for several years. Elementary enrolment decline in rural parts of the jurisdiction has impacted secondary enrolments. Enrolment is projected to remain relatively flat throughout the projection period.

It may be appropriate for staff to review potential for partnership opportunities at Norwell DSS in the fall of 2021. Consideration of partnerships will also need to reflect residential development planned in Palmerston and in other areas within the school's boundary and the projected longer-term impact on enrolment at both the elementary and secondary facilities.

Although Norwell DSS is projected to continue to meet the space threshold, the school would require retrofitting or the installation of additional security measures in order to segregate space for use by a community partner.

## French Immersion Enrolment Growth and Capacity

The following information describes FI enrolment growth and capacity information in addition to retention and participation rates.

## French Immersion Elementary Enrolment Trends

Table 5 shows FI enrolment changes by review area, since 2020. There are currently approximately 4,850 elementary FI students in the Upper Grand District School Board, and approximately 5,000 projected in 2022/23. The planning projections for FI assume that JK caps are met at all schools. This explains the increase projected in FI enrolment in 2022/23 as not all schools met their respective JK FI caps in 2021/22.

Table 6 shows the participation rate in FI, by review area. The JK FI participation rate for the Board in 2021/22 is 24%. The highest participation rate is in Erin, where almost 50% of the JK enrolment is in FI.

## FI Retention Rates

Table 7 demonstrates that the Board experiences a high level of retention in elementary FI. Overall, 95% of students in FI in Grade 1 remain in FI by Grade 8.

## **Dual Track School Enrolment**

The majority of dual track schools, those offering both Regular Track and French Immersion instruction, have relatively consistent participation rates by program.

Changes in participation rates evident in Table 8 are largely due to grade structure changes. Specifically, there are FI grades growing into Gateway Drive PS, Rockwood Centennial PS and Spencer Ave PS.
