### **COMMUNITY ADVOCACY**

#### Schools - Protecting our youth

Part of the mandate for DCCBA is to provide advocacy for the Black Community in Dufferin County in particular combating Anti-Black Racism and all forms of Systemic Discrimination. In February, DCCBA was proud to advocate on behalf of a resident in Dufferin-County when a youth was exposed to hurtful racist materials while in the classroom. DCCBA's quick response leveraging our partnership with the Upper Grand District School Board was able to get the material immediately removed from all schools and an apology issued to the family.

#### Covid-19 inequities

In March, DCCBA recognizing that the Black community along with other racialized groups were at heightened risk of contracting Covid-19 with severe outcomes, wrote to MPP Sylvia Jones and Public Health Officer for Dufferin-Caledon-Wellington-Guelph Dr. Nicola Mercer to take immediate steps to prioritize these groups when considering vaccination. DCCBA's President Alethia O'Hara Stephenson and Shelburne Deputy Mayor Steve Anderson subsequently had meetings with MPP Jones and Dr. Mercer and were left with assurances that high risks groups would be the focus of Phase 2 of the vaccine roll-out.

#### Anti-Asian Hate

Recently around the world and in Canada we have unfortunately seen the rise in hate crimes against the Asian community. While the Mandate of DCCBA is to advocate on the behalf of the Black community, this organization and its members refuse to stand idle in the face of such atrocities. DCCBA was proud to use its platform providing a statement calling for an immediate end to Anti-Asian racism while affirming our commitment to stand in solidarity with our cherished Asian community members.
