- Requests must relate to an organization, cause or event that contributes to the economic, social, and cultural fabric of the Town of Shelburne
- · Proclamations are issued at the discretion of the Mayor and Council
- An organization (i.e. requestor/recipient) may request one proclamation per year
- Proclamations are issued only to recognized local and regional organizations and not to individuals
- · Organizations do not have exclusive rights to the day, week or month being proclaimed
- . Proclamations of a similar topic will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis
- · All proclamation text is subject to approval and modification by the Town of Shelburne
- The Town of Shelburne will not pay for advertising costs involved in the issuance of proclamations

The flag raising ceremony marks the official launch of Black History Month celebrations in Canada. This meaningful event serves several purposes:

- 1. Raising Awareness: The flag raising ceremony raises awareness about the significant contributions, achievements, and experiences of Black Canadians throughout history.
- 2. Promoting Diversity and Inclusion: By celebrating Black History Month, we promote diversity, equity, and inclusion, recognizing the importance of creating a society that values and respects all individuals.
- 3. Honoring Heritage: The flag raising ceremony honors the rich heritage and cultural traditions of Black Canadians, acknowledging their struggles, triumphs, and ongoing contributions to Canadian society.

Background Information: Black History Month in Canada

Black History Month was officially recognized in 1995, following a motion introduced by the Honorable Jean Augustine, the first Black Canadian woman elected to Parliament. Since then, February has been designated as Black History Month in Canada, In 2019 The Town of Shelburne 1st proclaimed Black History Month and has been raising the Pan African Flag since 2020 providing an opportunity to:

- 1. Celebrate Achievements: Recognize the accomplishments and contributions of Black Canadians in various fields, including arts, culture, science, politics, and more.
- 2. Acknowledge Challenges: Acknowledge the historical and ongoing challenges faced by Black Canadians, including racism, discrimination, and systemic inequality.
- 3. Promote Education and Awareness: Educate Canadians about the rich history and experiences of Black Canadians, promoting greater understanding, empathy, and inclusivity.

By celebrating Black History Month, we reaffirm our commitment to creating a more inclusive and equitable society, where everyone has the opportunity to thrive and reach their full potential.

Guidelines for Flag Raising Requests*:

Council will consider requests that meet the following criteria:

- Have a connection with the Town of Shelburne.
- · Are non-commercial and non-partisan in nature.
- · Align with the Town's by-laws and policies.
- Fosters a sense of community or have made a significant impact within the community.
- · Demonstrate respect and acceptance for Shelburne residents.
- Celebrate a non-profit or charitable organization's events or awareness campaign.

The Town of Shelburne will not approve any requests that:

- · Espouses hatred, violence, racism, or offensive messages.
- Represents a political party, political organization, or candidates for election.
- Reflects an organization or group with activities that are contrary to the by-laws and policies of the Town.

The Town will consider requests for holidays, awareness days, weeks and months that are recognized through legislation by the Province of Ontario or the Government of Canada.
