On May 24<sup>th</sup>, under the authority of the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E.9, I issued an Order closing:

1. 3<sup>rd</sup> Line EHS from County Road 8 to 15 Sideroad in the Town of Mono.

On May 27th, the Emergency Road Closure was expanded to include:

- 2. 25 Sideroad from 1<sup>st</sup> Line EHS to 3<sup>rd</sup> Line EHS.
- 3. 2<sup>nd</sup> Line EHS from 25 Sideroad to 30 Sideroad.
- 4. 2<sup>nd</sup> Line EHS from County Road 8 to the terminus north of 20 Sideroad.
- 5. 20 Sideroad from 1st Line EHS to 2nd Line EHS.

The Emergency Road Closures were to address the safety of vehicles and pedestrians using these roads resulting from the sustained and unprecedented volume of traffic, including vehicles parking within the road allowances surrounding Mono Cliffs Provincial Park.

The Town of Mono took further actions to control traffic by establishing no parking zones on the roads adjacent to Mono Cliffs Provincial Park. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks put in place an online advance booking system to limit and control access to the park. These actions, combined with the Province moving to Step I, and soon to move to Step 2 of the Roadmap to Reopen, has further reduced the volume of traffic coming to the park.

The traffic and parking situation is no longer deemed an emergency and I, Laura Ryan, Mayor, hereby rescind the Emergency Road Closures effective immediately.
